ICS PRESIDENT STEVE GOLDSBY CHAIRS GOVERNOR'S SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY ROADMAP FOR ALABAMA (STRA) WORKING GROUP

FRESH PLANS TO GROW SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY JOBS IN ALABAMA

As the State of Alabama continues to advance as a leader in the global science and technology arena, Governor Bob Riley has called upon the state's technology innovators to lead the Science and Technology Roadmap for Alabama (STRA).
